The bedroom design shown promotes serenity by using tone-on-tone soft colors to create a calm atmosphere. She custom designed the bed using a fabric by Pierre Frey. The gold lamps act as an accent and offer a unique sculpture-like element to the room.

The nightstands, serving as the only wood pieces in the room, incorporate an organic element with their natural light tone and limestone top bringing the outdoors in to complement the artwork above the bed.

Dyer offers a few tips on mixing and incorporating textures into your bedroom space. "Some people think that wallpaper is very 1980s but actually it's a great and fashionable way to bring texture into a space," she says. "Trendsetting companies have come out with wonderful grass cloths and raffia weaves in natural tones that would incorporate nicely into a desert-themed home."

Throw pillows are the easiest way to add textures to a space, she recommends. Break out of the mold of buying pillows at stores over the counter — you have many more options by purchasing your own fabric and having them.

To add warmth and texture to a space, consider replacing blinds with drapery. Personalize your home by choosing your own fabric and enlisting a professional to measure and install them.
